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Epidemiology

[APHEOlist](#)

APHEOlist is the private, unmoderated listserv for members of the Association of Public Health Epidemiologists in Ontario. The purpose of the listserv is to improve communication among APHEO's members and affiliates. APHEO's Executive Committee uses it to send messages such as epidemiologist job advertisements, calls for volunteers for committees, APHEO updates, etc.

[EpiData List](#)

EpiData is public health software that is used for teaching, research and surveillance around the world. EpiData List is an open listserv that is intended for discussions, suggestions and troubleshooting help among users of EpiData. It is hosted by the University of Manitoba.

[CARRFS](#)

The Canadian Alliance for Regional Risk Factor Surveillance (CARRFS) is a network of public health stakeholders across Canada interested in working together to build and strengthening regional/local chronic disease risk factor surveillance. A listserv is available to CARRFS members, and there are no membership fees to join.

[ICES Alert](#)

ICES Alert is the alerting service of the Institute for Clinical Evaluative Sciences (ICES), an independent, non-profit organization, whose core business is to conduct research that contributes to the effectiveness, quality, equity and efficiency of health care and health services in Ontario. The ICES Alert feature makes it possible for visitors to be notified when new information, containing a keyword(s) or phrase, has been added to the ICES website.

[MMWR](#)

The Morbidity and Mortality Weekly Report (MMWR) series is prepared by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). Often called "the voice of CDC," the MMWR series is the agency's primary vehicle for scientific publication of timely, reliable, authoritative, accurate, objective, and useful public health information and recommendations. Publication alerts are available via email and RSS.
